According to the 'CA A Cancer Journal for Clinicians'\*, the estimated leading cause of cancer death for both men and women in the year 2002 is lung cancer. The second estimated leading cause of cancer death in the year 2002 for men is prostate cancer and for women is breast cancer. Colorectal cancer is the third estimated leading cause of cancer death in both men and women in the year 2002. These cancers are among the leading cancers accessioned into the Oncology Registry.

The 'CA Cancer Journal for Clinicians'\* reports that prostate, breast, lung, colon & rectum, leukemia, Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma, corpus uteri and melanoma of the skin among the leading sites for estimated new cancers in the U.S. 2002. These sites are also the leading sites accessioned into the Holden Cancer Center Oncology Registry.
