## ATLS® for Mid-Level Providers

### Course Description

The Advanced Trauma Life Support® for Mid-Level Providers Course is a two-day educational program designed for healthcare providers who are primarily responsible for managing the critically-injured patient.

### Educational Objectives

The content is intended to provide healthcare providers with one acceptable method of immediate management and the basic knowledge and skills necessary to:

- Assess the patient's condition rapidly and accurately.
- Perform primary resuscitation with decision to transfer and early stabilization on a priority basis.
- Perform a secondary assessment and further management, based upon priorities of care.
- Assure that optimum care is provided each step of the way.
- Initiate primary and secondary management necessary within the first hour of emergency care for acute life-threatening emergencies.
- Demonstrate skills used in the initial assessment and management of patients with multiple injuries during given clinical and surgical skill practicum.

### Continuing Education Credits

This course is held in cooperation with the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics Department of Nursing, an Iowa Board of Nursing approved provider Number 34. Full time attendance to this program will award 1.94 Continuing Education Units (CEUs) or 19.4 contact hours for full time attendance to this program.
