Course Overview

The Advanced Trauma Care for Nurses® Program (ATCN®) was developed in response to a need for advanced trauma education for nurses. The Society of Trauma Nurses is a professional, international nursing organization that sponsors this course.

The ATCN® course is taught concurrently with approved Advanced Trauma Life Support® (ATLS®) courses. Benefits of the ATCN® course include an educational, collaborative, synchronized team approach to trauma care with the participants of the simultaneous ATLS® course. Doctors and nurses caring for trauma patients have the opportunity to share a common language/approach to trauma care.

Nurses participating in this two-day course will attend interactive, hands-on skill stations designed specifically for the trauma nurse and taught by trauma nurses. This program meets all criteria required for trauma education for nurses and steps above the basic trauma courses currently available in Iowa.

Educational Objectives

Upon completion of this program, the participant should be able to provide one acceptable method of immediate management and the basic knowledge and skills necessary to:

- assess the trauma patient's condition rapidly and accurately;
- perform the primary and secondary assessment and resuscitation with decision to transfer on a priority basis;
- discuss indications for and treatment goals with nursing responsibilities for various airway adjuncts, management techniques in hemorrhagic shock, head trauma, spine and extremity trauma, and the special management techniques when dealing with pediatric trauma.
