Course Overview

The Emergency Nursing Pediatric Course (Provider) program is designed to provide core-level pediatric knowledge and psychomotor skills associated with professional nursing care provided to the pediatric patient. The ultimate goal of ENPC is to improve the care of the pediatric patient in the emergency care setting, and increase the skill and confidence of nurses who care for children.

Educational Objectives

Upon completion of this program, the participant will be able to:

- Describe the characteristics of life-threatening illness and injury to children.
- Identify the anatomic and physiologic characteristics of children as a basis for signs and symptoms.
- Identify the most frequent causes of illness or injury in children.
- Describe the assessment of children with illness or injury.
- Identify the appropriate nursing diagnoses and expected outcomes based on the assessment findings, plan specific interventions, and evaluate their effectiveness vs patient outcomes.

Faculty

This program is endorsed by the Emergency Nurses Association and the Iowa Chapter with faculty comprised of ENPC instructors from Iowa.

Intended Audience

This course is intended for licensed RNs who will be, or are now providing care to pediatric patients. Other Health care providers may audit the course on a space-available basis at a slightly reduced tuition rate without receipt of an Emergency Nurses Association (ENA) verification card or ENA CECHs.

Continuing Education Credits

This course is held in cooperation with the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics Department of Nursing, an Iowa Board of Nursing approved provider Number 34. Full time attendance to this program will award 1.7 Continuing Education Units (CEUs) or 17 contact hours for full time attendance to this program.

The Emergency Nurses Association will issue a card verifying the successful completion of the ENPC course. Expiration of the verification will occur four years from the date of issue.

The University of Iowa Health Care will award 18 hours continuing education for paramedics with 100 percent attendance.

Renewal Process

It is recommended that participants retake the entire course every four years (6 month grace period). Participants in the renewal course will successfully complete the written exam and three psychomotor testing stations. The EMSLRC will set up a review time for renewal participants after receiving the registration form.
