Purpose

The PHTLS course is designed to provide EMT-Basics, EMT-Intermediates, Paramedics and RNs with specific knowledge related to the prehospital assessment and care of the trauma patient. The PHTLS-Basic course is designed for EMT-Bs while the PHTLS-Advanced course is designed for EMT-Is, EMT-Ps and RNs. Specific knowledge related to the prehospital assessment and care of the trauma patient will be included in both courses.

Educational Objectives

Upon completion of this program, the participant will be able to:

- Describe the physiology, pathophysiology and kinetics of injury;
- Understand the need for a rapid assessment of the trauma patient;
- Describe the knowledge necessary to conduct assessment and the use of diagnostic skills;
- Describe specific intervention skills for prehospital trauma management;
- Provide an overview and establish a management method for the prehospital care of the multi-systems trauma patient.
