The Department of Family Medicine, University of Iowa is recruiting for faculty to fill exciting and challenging research opportunities. Selected candidates will join a progressive faculty of 31 MD and PhD members, with a strong cadre of dedicated researchers and excellent infrastructure support.

The Department has a practice-based research network affiliated with the Iowa Academy of Family Physicians, with 277 primary care physicians in 150 practice sites as members. Research interests of departmental members are focused on chronic disease management, especially in cardiovascular disease and diabetes, cancer prevention, rural medicine, elder abuse and information management in clinical settings.

The University of Iowa ranks 13th among public institutions in NIH funding and was recently designated an NIH CTSA award to support translational research. The Department is an integral part of this research effort. The University of Iowa is located in Iowa City, a community that ranks in the top tier of best places to live.

The following positions are available:

Iowa Academy of Family Physicians Endowed Chair in Rural Medicine: This senior-level tenured position will provide strategic direction in the development of rural research in the State of Iowa, where approximately 40% of the 2.9 million Iowa residents live in non-metropolitan areas. In addition to the requirements below, candidates should have a successful record in research with a demonstrated ability to obtain research funding, and evidence of experience and knowledge relating to issues in rural health care.

Associate and/or Assistant/Associate Professors: These positions seek faculty who are committed to developing careers in primary care research. At least 50% protected time over a three-year period will be offered, with additional protected time based on funded support.

All positions require:

- Board certification in Family Medicine
- Eligible for licensure in the State of Iowa
- Clinically active

- 1) A cover letter describing your immediate and long-range (5-7 years) career objectives, and your specific areas of strength and interest relating to research, education and patient care.
- 2) An up-to-date Curriculum Vitae.
- 3) Three letters of reference addressing the quality of scholarly activity, teaching and patient care and contributions to the discipline of Family Medicine.
