

Staff Nurse Positions Available in Medical/Surgical Services

Within the [Medical/Surgical Services](#) division are the inpatient units and clinics for adult leukemia and bone marrow transplant; gastrointestinal surgery, solid organ transplant, bariatric surgery; gynecology/oncology; hematology/oncology; medical-surgical oncology; medicine specialty; orthopaedics, urology, and dermatology; and otolaryngology/head and neck. The division includes clinics for adult medicine specialty, digestive diseases, cancer, dermatology, spine research and rehabilitation, ophthalmology, oral surgery, orthopaedics, otolaryngology/head and neck, radiation oncology, rheumatology, surgery, and urology.

Note: Initial two week internal posting period dates are identified for all new positions. To submit a contract transfer for a nursing position covered by SEIU, please submit Form 700, Application for Transfer/Status Change, indicating the position of interest to Nursing Human Resources no later than 4:30 PM on the last day of the posting period. Full and part-time positions in:

Outpatient Transplant Clinic (1JC) (Internal Recruitment)

- 11/11/09 • 100%, Days, 8 hour shifts, Monday through Friday. Requires flexible work hours to cover on-call duties on off shifts, weekends, and holidays. Requires 2 yrs experience in end organ failure nursing and recent outpatient experience.

Orthopaedics, Urology, and Dermatology (3RC) (Internal Recruitment)

- 11/11 – 11/25/09 • 90%, Nights, 8 or 12 hour shifts, with weekend rotation.
- 11/11 – 11/25/09 • 60%, Day/Night, 8 or 12 hour shifts, with weekend rotation.

Otolaryngology/Head and Neck (3JPW)

- 11/11/09 • 100%, Day/Night, 8 or 12 hour shifts, with rotating days off and weekend rotation. 2 positions available.

Adult Leukemia and Bone Marrow Transplant (7RCS)

- 11/11/09 • 50%, Day/Night, 8 and 12 hour shifts, rotating days off, every other weekend.

** Orientation to a new position usually comprises full-time hours. Benefit accruals and compensation are based on percentage of the appointment.*
